Department pursuing separate AACSB accounting accreditation

The Kelce College of Business was accredited by the AACSB International - The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business in April 1999. The AACSB International also separately accredits accounting programs at accredited business colleges. Currently, 159 of 430 accredited business colleges have separate accounting accreditation. In Kansas this includes the University of Kansas, Kansas State University, and Wichita State University. In PSU's athletic conference, the MIAA, only Central Missouri State University and Truman State University have attained separate accounting accreditation.

In September 2002, the PSU Department of Accounting voted to pursue separate accounting accreditation. The PSU administration is supportive of this project as is the Accounting Advisory Council, who passed a resolution of support for this initiative at their October 2002 meeting. In January 2003, the Department officially entered the precandidacy stage for separate accounting accreditation. AACSB International will now assign an advisor to help the Department conduct a self-assessment. The purpose of the self-assessment is to determine the extent to which our accounting programs meet the standards for separate accounting accreditation. The Department will then enter the candidacy stage, a period of time not to exceed five years, during which the Department must work toward meeting the accreditation standards.

The benefits of separate accounting accreditation are numerous. Pursuing separate accreditation demonstrates our commitment to continuous improvement. Attaining separate accounting accreditation will enhance our reputation among our various stakeholders, especially those beyond the local region who may not be familiar with PSU or the Department of Accounting. Separate accounting accreditation is recognized around the world and will enhance the value of our degrees for all our alumni. It is also expected to help us attract and retain high quality students and faculty, and enlarge the pool of prospective employers, some of whom prefer to hire graduates from accounting programs with separate accounting accreditation.

The process to attain separate accounting accreditation will be challenging. Most worthwhile endeavors are. This is a valuable distinction for our students and alumni and we look forward to the challenges that lie ahead. We appreciate your continued support during this process. We also ask that you consider increasing your support as we seek to move the PSU Department of Accounting toward this nationally recognized designation.

From the (interim) chair

We have had several administrative changes in the Kelce College of Business since our last newsletter. First, Dr. Ron Clement resigned as Dean in June 2002 so that he could devote more time to teaching and research. Dr. Clement is now a professor in the Department of Management and Marketing at PSU. Second, the Chair of the Department of Accounting, Dr. J. Russell Hardin, was named Interim Dean of Kelce. A national search is underway for a permanent dean, and Dr. Hardin is a candidate for this position. Third, I accepted the position of Interim Chair in the Department of Accounting. If Dr. Hardin is appointed Dean, it is anticipated that an internal search will be conducted for a permanent chair.

Reding 2002 Outstanding Faculty

Government Association. Dr. Reding joined the PSU faculty in 1997. Since joining our faculty he has initiated, and been instrumental in implementing, several highly successful programs including the Endorsed Internal Auditing Program (EIAP), the student internship program (see related story page 4), and the Institute of Internal Auditors Student Chapter (IIASC) (see related story page 3). Dr. Reding also serves as the faculty advisor to IIASC.

In addition to his outstanding service to the Department and our students, Dr. Reding also manages a teaching load that includes Financial Accounting (ACCTG 201), Information Technology and Accounting Systems (ACCTG 420), Internal Auditing (ACCTG 422), Information Systems Auditing and Controls (ACCTG 522), Internship in Accounting (ACCTG 614), and Financial Statement Auditing (ACCTG 915). An article he published in *Internal Auditor*, received The Institute of Internal Auditors' Thurston Award, designating it the outstanding paper in the field of internal auditing for 2001.

Petition filed to establish a Beta Alpha Psi Chapter

Beta Alpha Psi (BAP) is the premier student organization for the best and brightest accounting majors. Recruiters often expect the best accounting majors to be active members of BAP. In the past, PSU has not had a chapter of BAP because a prerequisite for having a local chapter is AACSB International accreditation of the business college, which we attained in April 1999. Recognizing the importance attached to membership in BAP by recruiters and other stakeholders, the Department of Accounting has filed a petition to establish a local chapter at PSU. We must now meet the national requirements for local chapters for at least four semesters before our chapter will be installed.

BAP will expand the professional development opportunities available to our best students. Active membership in BAP is also expected to be a competitive advantage in the job market. Traditionally, BAP was exclusively for accounting majors. Recently, they have redefined their scope to include students in the business information field. This includes students majoring in accounting, finance, or information systems. Although the impetus for establishing the local chapter is originating in the Department of Accounting, we anticipate working closely with our colleagues in finance and information systems so that we can attract their best students into active membership in BAP. We hope the interaction among these three majors will lead to more of the best students in the College of Business pursuing double majors, or minors, from among these three fields. With the continuing convergence of these three fields, this expanded skill set should benefit our students and prospective employers.

Continuous Improvement in Accounting Fund

The Department of Accounting has benefited tremendously from the generous donations of our alumni and friends. Your past support helped build the strong accounting program we have at PSU. Our decision to pursue separate accounting accreditation by the AACSB International has numerous benefits to our stakeholders. However, it will require a sustained source of operating funds from private sources to attain, and then maintain, the accreditation standards. The Continuous Improvement in Accounting Fund has been established to help support our Department's initiative to pursue separate AACSB International accounting accreditation. With state resources scarce, contributions to this fund will be an invaluable source of operating funds for our Department.

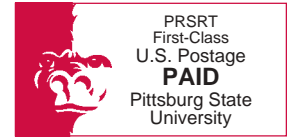
