- Provides up to \$7,500 per year for educational expenses to sophomores and juniors who intend to pursue careers in mathematics, the natural sciences, or engineering.
- Must be a full-time matriculated sophomore or junior pursuing a degree at an accredited institution of higher education during the current academic year, have a college grade-point average of at least "B", and a United States citizen.
