

Master of Science Degree in Educational Leadership

Building Level Program - Galena

The master's degree program in Educational Leadership is a 36 to 39-hour program designed to prepare licensed education practitioners to assume leadership roles within the K-12 education system. Experiences will be provided for educators to acquire knowledge and skills in curriculum development, legal issues, research, educational foundations, and special education. Individuals completing this program will have the opportunity to obtain their conditional building level licensure, followed by their unconditional building level licensure.

The Master's in Educational Leadership has two strands:

1. Licensure as a building leader
2. Non-licensure for educational leader – designed for people who want to take leadership roles within schools and not-for-profit agencies but do not wish to become licensed as a school principal.

We will offer all the core courses and those for the Licensure Strand in Galena. In Spring and Fall semesters, you will take two courses “bundled” on Monday evenings from 5 – 9 p.m., with each of the courses augmented by online instruction, group projects, individual projects, and field experiences. In the Summer session, you will take two online courses.
