Re: **H1N1 Vaccine Now Available for High Risk Population – All Ages**

Eligibility Requirements

Under the direction of Crawford County Health Department Health Officer, Janice Goedeke, we are now able to offer the inactivated H1N1 vaccine to **ANY** individual who has a chronic medical condition regardless of age.

Chronic medical conditions that confer a higher risk for influenza-related complication include:

- Respiratory Conditions (including asthma, COPD)
- Pregnancy
- Heart Disease
- Kidney Disorders
- Liver Disorders
- Neurological Disorders (including epilepsy, cerebral palsy, brain or spinal cord injury)
- Diabetes
- Blood Disorders
- Immunosuppression conditions (caused by medications, HIV, or cancer)

At this time, we are not offering this vaccine to healthy individuals without a chronic medical condition.

The schedule for future delivery of additional H1N1 vaccine is not certain. Student Health Services will provide additional information regarding availability to expanded populations as supply is sufficient. Please check our website www.pittstate.edu/health for updated H1N1 information.

If you meet the above criteria and would like to schedule an appointment to receive the H1N1 vaccine - please call 235-4452. Students may schedule an appointment online at www.pittstate.edu/health. You may also walk-in between 8 am and 4 pm at our new location at 1801 S Broadway. The H1N1 vaccine is being offered free of charge. We are offering the vaccine to current PSU students, faculty and staff, and spouses of faculty and staff. We will not be offering the vaccine to children of students, faculty or staff at this time.
