**NOTE:** When a student attains 85 semester hours of credit (including current enrollment) the student must apply for a degree check from the Degree Checking Office.

**Minimum General Requirements:** The university minimum requirements for graduation include 128 semester hours of which 60 hours must be from a four-year university. In addition, 45 semester hours must be upper division and 30 hours in residence at Pittsburg State University (including 24 of the last 30). Minimum GPA are 2.0 overall, 2.0 in the major, 2.0 in the minor, and 2.0 in the resident courses at PSU. Specific General Education requirements for all Baccalaureate Degrees are listed in the university catalog.

A grade below "C" represents work of poor quality, not adequate to pursue subsequent courses. For this reason, a "D" or "F" grade in major (CMCET) or math support courses will not be accepted to satisfy pre-requisite or graduation requirements. Courses must be repeated for a minimum grade of "C".)
