COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is a survey of the culture of contemporary France with emphasis on history, politics, economics, customs, and traditions.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

The main objective of this course is to offer students the means to develop critical thinking, to improve reading comprehension, written and oral proficiency in French through practice in reading, writing and speaking.

GOALS:

- .Students will improve writing skills in French through essays and written answers.

STUDENTS RESPONSIBILITIES:

Your daily assignment will be given in each class session. This includes preparing answers to turn in. Preparation means to write in answers and be ready to read them in class when asked. Always have two copies of written answers: one, for the instructor that you turn in, and one for you to use orally.

You will have Homework (Devoirs). Homework will consist of writing essays after doing research in the internet.

You will write a final paper.
