Registering Game Systems for Internet Access

By registering the MAC address for you console, it can access the network the same way as your wired PC.

For an XBOX 360:

1. Go to the "System" area of the Xbox Dashboard
2. Select "Network Settings"
3. Select "Edit Settings"
4. Select "Additional Settings"
5. Select "Advanced Settings"
6. At the bottom of this screen you'll see a heading called "Wired MAC Address," which is your MAC address.

For a PS3

1. Go to "Settings"
2. Select "Network Settings"
3. Select "Connection"
4. There may be 2 MAC addresses listed, the first is the router you are using. Your PS3's MAC address is the one listed at the bottom.

For a Wii:

1. From the Wii Channel menu, select "Wii Settings" (the round button on the bottom-left of the screen with "Wii" on it).
2. Select "Internet," then "Console Settings."
3. The MAC address of the Wii console is displayed on the first line.

After determining the MAC address of your device, you can register this MAC from the GUS system. Select the ResNet Menu, and then "Register Additional Device". Enter the MAC address of your game system, and you will have internet access to your system.

* XBOX Original game systems may not work since they generate their own MAC address newer versions may if the MAC address can be set.
