## Undergraduate Admission Requirements and Academic Advising <br> Upon admission to Pittsburg State University, entering first year students and transfer students receive advisement and enrollment support through the Kelce Academic Advising Office located on the first floor of the Kelce Center. Upon completion of 30 hours and formal admission to the Kelce College of Business, a student pursing a BBA will be assigned a faculty advisor teaching in their declared major area of study. Formal admission to the Kelce College of Business occurs upon completion of the following requirements:

- Completion of at least 30 credit hours applicable to the degree.
- Achievement of a 2.25 cumulative grade point average (note, a 2.5 cumulative grade point average is required for Accounting and Computer Information Systems majors).
- Completion of these courses with a C or better: English Composition (ENGL 101 or ENGL 190) Introduction to Research Writing (ENGL 299 or ENGL 190) Speech Communications (COMM 207) College Algebra or Calculus (MATH 110, MATH 113, MATH 126, or MATH 150)
Elementary Statistics (MATH 143) Computer Information Systems (CIS 130)
Financial Accounting (ACCTG 201)
Admission to the Kelce College of Business is required prior to enrollment in all upper level business courses numbered 300 and above with the exception of MGT 310 Business Statistics for those students who have completed MATH 143 Elementary Statistics.
Business minors, non-degree seeking students, exchange students, and students with other degree objectives will be allowed to take business courses numbered 300 and above if they meet the specific course prerequisites as outlined in the university catalog.


## Kelce College of Business Prerequisite Policy

- All business courses numbered in the 200's have a sophomore-standing prerequisite requirement. Sophomore standing is defined as the completion of 25 semester hours.
- All business courses numbered 300 and above require admission to the Kelce College of Business with the exception of MGT 310 Business Statistics for those students who have completed MATH 143 Elementary Statistics.
- All courses indicating senior-standing prerequisite are defined as the completion of 85 semester hours.
- All students are required to complete Kelce College of Business prerequisites as outlined in the Pittsburg State University Catalog. If a student is enrolled in a course without completion of the required prerequisite, the student will receive notice to seek advising for schedule revisions. If the schedule is not revised or approved prior to the first day of class, the Kelce Academic Advising office will administratively remove the class from the student's schedule.

When a student attains 85 semester hours of credit (including current enrollment) the student must apply for a degree check in the Office of the Registrar (Degree Checking Section), Room 102 Russ Hall.

MINIMUM GENERAL REQUIREMENTS: The minimum requirements for graduation include 124 semester hours of which 60 hours must be from a four year university. In addition, 45 semester hours must be upper division and 30 hours in residence at PSU (including 24 of the last 30 ). Minimum GPA for non-education degree is 2.0 overall [ 2.0 in major], secondary education degree is 2.5 overall [ 2.75 in major], and early/late childhood/unified degree is 2.80 overall [ 3.0 in major]. A minimum GPA of 2.0 in any minor and in residence coursework is required. General Education and all degree requirements are provided in the online catalog. Refer to individual departments for specific requirements.
