Professional Critiques-Matt Moyer

Actors need directors. When an actor acts, they clearly cannot see themselves. In the actor's mind, they might be flawless. However, the director can point out where their performance can be improved. If you are a senior and are working on your portfolio to apply for college scholarships, bring in one piece of your best work to be critiqued by a professional artist, Matt Moyer. Matt will act as your director helping your artwork improve in technique or concept. Matt Moyer earned a BFA in Ceramics from Illinois State University and has earned his MFA in Ceramics and Sculpture from the University of Missouri. During graduate school he traveled to Taiwan, serving for six months as Artist in Residence at Tainan National University of the Arts where he also exhibited his work.

I. Workshop Descriptions

Workshop #1: Critical Response Process

Leader: Portico Bowman

Description: Critical Response Process, developed and presented by Liz Lerman, MacArthur

Genius Award winner, is a protocol for providing critical feedback to anyone about anything, but

in particular has been designed, implemented and practiced in the fields of art, dance, and other

creative fields along with applications for business, parenting or making a cake. S.Portico

Bowman studied with Lerman for two months while on sabbatical at Arizona State University

this past fall. This workshop is offered as a professional development tool for teachers who

would like to be introduced to the concepts and practice them. The technique promises to provide

Workshop #2: Cubism Workshop

Leader: Luis Calderon

Description: Luis Calderon will teach students about the most revolutionary art movement in art

history, Cubism. Participants will discuss the artists who contributed to Cubism's founding, but

also dive into the various techniques that made it one of the most popular and controversial art

movements of the 20th century. Students will learn to visually see cubism within a still life and

will be encouraged to stylize their work to their liking.

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Workshop #3: Intro to Concept Design

Leaders: Will Cowley and Elliecia Hall

Description: This workshop will consist of two key elements used in concept design; world

development and character design. During this workshop, students will get to learn tips and

tricks on how to create vivid and imaginative worlds from scratch as well as creative and unique

characters to live in these worlds.

Workshop #4: Textured Copper Bracelets

Leaders: Shea Dalton and Reyna Gabriel

Description: A textured copper bracelet is the final product of this hands-on workshop. Students

will learn to use a rolling mill and metal stamps to create texture in copper blanks, then use cold

forging techniques to shape the textured metal into wearable bands.

Workshop #5: Art of Automotive

Leader: Joshua Kukowski

Description: Art of Automotive is a workshop that will introduce students to basic skills used to

draw cars. Students will learn basic proportions of cars while drawing a car in profile and

portrait views. The students will then learn to transfer those drawing into isometric view of the

car using perspective.

Workshop #6: Basic Digital Art

Leaders: Levi Qualls and Christopher Griffetts

Description: This workshop is intended to teach artists the basics of digital devices as an art

medium. Participants will leave with a basic understanding of digital art and should be well on

their way to start exploring with this artistic medium.

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Workshop #7: Constructing the Figure in Wire

Leader: Sophia Stapleton

Description: Students will be walked through the process of making a simple human figure in

wire that will be useful in drawing could serve as a sculpture armature or a stand-alone sculptural

study. The finished wire sculpture will be under 10 inches tall with an elongated form.

Workshop #8: Chinese Calligraphy

Leader: Li-Lin Tseng

Description: Are you interested in learning Chinese calligraphy and using it to make cards for

holidays, birthdays, or other celebrations? If so, sign up for this workshop. You will learn how

to grind ink as well as how to manipulate a brush on rice paper! No knowledge of the Chinese

language required.

Workshop #9: Pollock Splatter!

Leaders: Jessica Switzer and Jewel Schroeder

Description: A workshop inspired by Jackson Pollock's Abstract Expressionist artwork. Splatter

acrylic paint on canvas to create fun designs. Be prepared for a messy adventure exploring your

abstract creativity. You'll be provided with cups of paint, card stock for designs, canvas, and

brushes. Wear appropriate clothes and shoes you aren't afraid to get splattered!

Workshop #10: Anatomy and Human Structure

Leader: Sarah Walden

Description: Participants in this drawing workshop will learn the basics of human anatomy and

refer to reference images for their future study. Topics explored will include basic structures,

bony landmarks, proportions, and measurements of the human body.

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
