PSU Kelce College of Business

The Kelce College of Business is staffed by highly qualified and experienced faculty. Thirty of the thirty five fulltime faculty have doctorate degrees, several have attained the highest faculty ranking of University Professor.

The Kelce College of Business' chapter of Beta Gamma Sigma (a dean's honor society) was recognized by its International Board of Governors as an exemplary chapter. This enables participation in Beta Gamma Sigma's matching funds scholarship program.

The Kelce College of Business' chapter of Beta Alpha Psi (a national accounting honor society) was recognized by the national board of directors as a distinguished chapter. Each student in the chapter is required to perform 20 hours worth of service and assist in outreach activities.

Omicron Delta Epsilon (an international honor society) that recognizes students for outstanding achievement in economics is active in Kelce.

Jungle Journeys (a unique co-curricular program) offers students the opportunity to develop a personal marketing plan, find an industry that provides a good fit, experience work and leadership opportunities and develop an appreciation for cultural activities that make life fun.

The College produces a Summer International Mini-MBA program which attracts participants from around the world for a three week certificate program conducted by Kelce faculty.

The Kelce College is one of a few schools to be certified in information security by the U.S. Committee on National Security Systems. The internal auditing program has been endorsed by the Institute of Internal Auditors. Course work has been developed in the new and expanding field of Computer Forensics.

All business students participate in a nationally normed test that measures knowledge in every major field of study in business. The results are compared with 100s of business schools across the country. Kelce students, over the past five years, have consistently scored above the national average in every area assessed.

Strategy students compete in a business simulation game along with nearly 2000 student teams worldwide. Kelce students are consistently in the top 100 worldwide. Our teams have participated in world cup competitions in this event.

A Kelce student team was named a top ten team in the nation in the American Institute of CPAs accounting and sustainability competition out of over 130 teams competing.

The College is the home of the *Journal of Managerial Issues*, and *The American Economist*, two toplevel peer-reviewed academic journals.

The PSU chapter of Students in Free Enterprise is housed in the College of Business. For the fifth year in a row PSU SIFE is a Regional Champion and will compete in the national meet in Kansas City in May.





Top 15 in the Nation

The business college at Pittsburg State University was named one of the top business colleges in the nation, based on student satisfaction, by *Entrepreneur* magazine, a leading publication for and about entrepreneurs. In its April 2009 issue, the magazine listed the MBA programs most highly rated by their students in six areas key to a successful career in business.



The Kelce College of Business is accredited by AACSB International. Accreditation represents "the highest standard of achievement for business schools, worldwide. Institutions that earn accreditation confirm their commitment to quality and continuous improvement through a rigorous and comprehensive peer review." Less than 5% of the business colleges in the world achieve accreditation.



Pittsburg State University's Kelce College of Business is currently listed in the "Best 294 Business Schools," a guidebook published annually by The Princeton Review. The Review contacted more than 19,000 MBA students at the best 294 AACSB-accredited MBA programs in the world to solicit opinions about what they consider to be the best business colleges in the world.
