Dance Program & Bicknell Center Host 2nd Annual Dance Showcase

PSU's Minor and Certificate in Dance Program hosted the 2nd Annual Dance Showcase at the Linda and Lee Scott Performance Hall of the Bicknell Family Center for the Arts Monday, March 6th.

This year, over 320 people performed at the showcase. There were 39 dance numbers performed not only by HHPR students in the Dance Program but also area and regional studios including the Y Academy of Dance, Ovation Studios, The Dance Pitt, Pittsburg Parks and Recreation Dance Program, Karen's Dance Studio, Linn County Dance and Cheer and Midwest Regional Ballet. The PSU Crimson and Gold Dance Team as well as dance teams from Pittsburg High School and Frontenac High School performed. The PSU Dance Club and Pittsburg Community Theatre also participated in the show. The showcase featured PSU's very own students minoring in dance in five separate numbers. This year, for the first time, an audition took place in order to allow PSU Dance Minor students an opportunity to perform a

solo or duet. As a result, Gracie Spencer and Jenna Gold were featured in solo performances and Cameron and Mackenzie Moore in a duet!

The Bicknell Center estimated 800-900 people in attendance excluding the performers! In addition, the event was livestreamed and the following statistics were reported:



Alumni Spotlight Deborah Newkirk





Deborah Newkirk has over 3 decades of experience in youth coaching. She is a physical educator who was told during her undergraduate degree, she would need to focus on one field or the other; teaching or coaching. Deborah has spent a professional lifetime bringing the two worlds together, as intended. She earned both her undergrad and M.S. Ed. From Pittsburg State University (Pittsburg, Kansas).

Deborah stepped away from competitive coaching after twenty years and focused on training. Today, COACH 'EM UP serves as a resource for many families. Her coaching certification program teaches the positive and effective model and methodologies, mentoring eager coaches to feel confident and prepared. Year-round off-the-floor training programs have been a big part of the COACH 'EM UP success, providing young athletes with motivating and organized means of "touches" and play in their backyards.

COACH KIDS UP is her newest dream-come-true company that recently launched (Fall 2015). This web-based app company provides organized, age-appropriate/progression practice plans through short videos for all sports. Through PE curriculum concepts, COACH KIDS UP empowers young and new volunteer coaches along with backyard moms and dads.

Newkirk has been recognized in both fields with Coach of the Year honors as a High School coach and Physical Educator of the Year honors by the National Association of Sport and Physical Education (NASPE). She was named Physical Educator of the Year by Kansas Association of Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance (KAHPERD). Among her honors, Newkirk was also recognized by the Governor's Council on Fitness, noting her efforts in keeping kids moving in the early 90s.


Legendary Naismith Hall of Fame coach Marian Washington hired Newkirk as Women's Basketball Assistant Coach at the University of Kansas, where a Sweet 16 visit topped off that tenure. Newkirk served as a camp director for KU for over a decade. Today, Newkirk and COACH 'EM UP can be found in gyms around the country, partnering with other programs, serving as a consultant and/or camp director. Coach Newkirk serves as a consultant and camp lead at The University of Texas and The University of Virginia. Legendary Olympian, Naismith Hall of Famer, and longtime friend, Lynette Woodard and Newkirk partnered up in 2009, teaching the game of basketball while playing homage to Dr. James Naismith with Rule 13 Athletics.

In 2015, Deborah partnered with the Art of Coaching Volleyball, the premier, top content providing company for coaches of all levels. Today, she provides content and recently joined forces in producing her first book; YEARS 1-6 YOUTH VOLLEYBALL CURRICULUM. She will be presenting her book at the TAHPERD State Convention this upcoming November and in San Antonio with the AOCVB this Spring.



REC 435 IN KANSAS CITY

Dr. Hardy's Design & Maintenance of Recreation Facilities (REC 435) class drove to Kansas City on April 7th to tour Schlitterbahn Kansas City and the Kansas Speedway. The class was given a behind the scenes tour of each facility and were introduced to the unique design and maintenance issues that each facility deals with during both in-season and out-of-season operations.

Schlitterbahn is a 40-acre waterpark that plans to further develop the remaining 300 acres surrounding the waterpark with commercial multi-use offices and restaurants to enhance the park. The waterpark's interconnected rivers stretch over two miles in length. The class also learned that Schlitterbahn Kansas City has a moat built around the entire park as a security measure.

The Kansas Speedway, sitting on 1200 acres and owned and operated by the International Speedway Corporation, is a 1.5-mile tri-oval that currently hosts two NASCAR Race weekends per year. Those two race weekends alone, each generate approximately the same economic impact as the NFL Super Bowl generates in a week. The infield of the speedway is large enough to fit Arrowhead Stadium, Kaufman Stadium (and the parking lot between the two stadiums), Sporting Kansas City's Children's Mercy Park, and the Kansas City T-Bones' Community America Ballpark within it while barely touching the inside of the track.

The class gained a great deal of knowledge and were amazed at the scope of the operations of each facility. This was an outside the classroom applied learning component of the class to further the students' ability to connect theory taught in the classroom to real world experiences.



Exercise Science News

Exercise Science is currently conducting a total of four research projects.

<u>Kylie Brown</u> is currently developing a regression equation model to predict maximal oxygen consumption from an anaerobic treadmill test, which is also her master's thesis project. Her regression equation will provide a model for both males and females in a trained or untrained state. We look forward to Kylie Brown's thesis defense in the second half of this semester.

<u>Jessica Heinz</u> is over-seeing a cardiovascular training intervention study to see if super-maximal training has comparative benefits to traditional moderate intensity aerobic training.

<u>Nicholas Drake</u> is currently over-seeing two projects that are concerned with training methodologies within hypertrophy and strength training. One research project is investigating the relationship of training to failure versus non-failure training. The second research project is comparing powerlifting training programs found in popular books.

<u>Dr. Derek Crawford</u> is in the final stages of submitting a peer-reviewed research article over a study he conducted in the spring of 2016 over the short-term effects of Cross Fit and its potential benefits.


