- I. This committee is most definitely needed; proposed rewritten purposes are #2 below.
- II. This subcommittee shall:
 - a. Explore the influences of a variety of thought processes and multiculturalism in instruction, in the curriculum, and in the academic content of various disciplines.

- b. Serve as liaison among the organized affinity groups on campus, including the Tilford Group, Campus and Community Resource Center (CCRC), and academic units requiring accreditation.
- c. Develop curriculum resources which recognize varied cultural perspectives.
- III. We do not wish to change the composition of this committee, but some edits are included: Composition: This committee shall consist of one faculty member from the Department of Teaching and Leadership, one faculty member from Teacher Education (Secondary), one faculty member from each of the other college/schools (Arts and Sciences, Business, and Technology), two at-large faculty members, and two students. The Associate Vice President for Campus and Community Resources, The Director of International Programs and the Director of Institutional Equity and Title 9 Coordinator shall serve as ex-officio members of the committee.

AI Ad Hoc Committee

PSU Fac Sen Gen Al Ad Hoc Committee met October 15th

- Discussed the data from past surveys to help identify the PSU landscape. Using the faculty responses, the group is building a list of key findings and major themes. Big picture issues include:
 - Seeking policy and institutional guidance
 - o Requests for more ethical use and framework for academic integrity
 - Additional training and professional development
 - Pedagogical support and curriculum integration
 - Resource Repositories and Tool Guidance
- Based on the big picture issues, the Ad Hoc is focusing on three areas
 - Goal 1. Create campus wide standardized language faculty should use to designate the degree of "acceptable AI use" in their course. And recommend that these are added to campus syllabi.
 - Goal 2. Create recommendations on where the "Acceptable AI use" designations can live to increase transparency for students and set expectations.
 - Goal 3. Help develop language to broaden and better define Academic Dishonesty.
- Group is looking at institutions that have shared their syllabus statements and best practice documents online at the moment.

 Goal - For the November meeting, deliver to Senate a short version of the report that outlines from the campus surveys the needs, the research, and the language recommendations based on best practices.

Faculty Senate Artificial Intelligence (AI) Ad Hoc Committee
Word Document submitted to Faculty Senate on Monday, December 1, 2025

Background

The Faculty Senate established the Artificial Intelligence Ad Hoc Committee in Spring 2025 to examine the evolving role of AI in teaching, research, and service at Pittsburg State University. The committee conducted campus-wide surveys, reviewed practices at peer and other institutions, and gathered faculty perspectives to identify emerging needs and opportunities.

The goal is to ensure that PSU approaches AI-related decisions with meaningful faculty input and provides clear and consistent guidance that safeguards academic integrity and autonomy.

Key Findings from Survey Data

- Faculty are using Al, but unevenly. Most faculty have experimented with Al tools, in some capacity, without consistent institutional guidance.
- Policy ambiguity creates confusion. Many faculty are unsure whether departmental or university policies exist regarding AI use.
- Ethical and integrity concerns remain. Faculty seek tools to help students use AI responsibly without compromising learning outcomes and preserving integrity.
- Training and support are strongly desired. Faculty across disciplines expressed the need for professional development, model assignments, and secure AI resources.
- Shared governance is essential. Faculty expressed guidance on AI should emerge from a collaborative decision-making process, rather than top-down directives.

Why Senate Action Matters

Without clear institutional policy language and shared understanding, both students and faculty face uncertainty about expectations and ethical use. Faculty Senate involvement ensures that PSU remains at the forefront of responsible innovation while preserving instructor autonomy and academic freedom.

Summary of Recommendations

The AI Ad Hoc Committee recommends that Faculty Senate:

- 1. **Provide AI Use designations statements** that allow instructors to designate their preferred level of AI use within their courses.
- 2. Adopt unified institutional definitions of AI that include generative, predictive, and assistive technologies.
- 3. Support professional development and AI literacy initiatives for faculty and students, with a strong emphasis on ethics, privacy, and responsible use.
- 4. Transition the Ad Hoc Committee into a standing interdisciplinary committee to monitor developments, advising on policy, and provide annual updates.

Next Steps

The committee developed standardized AI Use category language for Syllabus Statements. These will be submitted to Senate for review and a vote. The group will continue working on language for the other recommendations.

Other Institutions reviewed: Boise State University, Southern Utah University, Auburn University, Ferris State University, Kansas State University, University of Minnesota, & Western Michigan University. *Draft of full report, accessible here.

Three Categories of AI Use designation: Allowed, Conditional, Prohibited.

Definition of an Emphasis

Area of Emphasis is a specific subject area that exists within an approved degree program and major. At Pittsburg State University a minimum of 12 credit hours and no more than 24 credit hours are expected for an area of emphasis in a baccalaureate degree program.

Definition of a Minor

Minors at Pittsburg State University may range from 15 to 24 credit hours. When selected to accompany a degree that requires a minor there must be at least nine unique credit hours in the minor that are not found in the student's major in order to meet graduation requirements. In instances where the major requires a minor (not the degree type), academic departments/schools may specify minors that best achieve the learning objective for their students.

Definition of Certificate Program

A certificate program can be undergraduate or graduate in course content and provides a specific body of knowledge for personal or career development or professional continuing education. Certificates may be taken while also pursuing a degree or independent from any other studies at Pittsburg State University. It is recommended that if the student is only pursuing a certificate and not in conjunction with a degree and wishes to apply for federal financial assistance that they visit with personnel in the Student Financial Assistance office regarding the eligibility for aid for the certificate of interest. At Pittsburg State University a certificate can range from 12 credit hours to 24 credit hours.
