Report for the Diversity and Multicultural Affairs Committee for April 25, 2022

The Diversity and Multicultural Affairs Committee met on Tuesday, April 5th, 2022.

Our committee met with PSU organizations such as the Office of Student Diversity (OSD) and the International Student Association (ISA) in 2021 to brainstorm about ways in which we could support campus diversity. We determined that one the best ways to do this would be to help promote OSD and ISA events in our classes.

The following is a list of some of our accomplishments this academic year:

- (1) We have been able to promote many OSD and ISA events in our classes.
- (2) Some of our students were able to attend these events.
- (3) We have had faculty presence at many of these events.
- (4) In some cases, we were able to offer incentives such as extra credit to students who attended or participated in the events.

The following is a list of some of the events we have helped promote or support:

- (1) ISA's Tastes & Sounds of Nations (2021) and the International Food & Culture Fair (2022)
- (2) Hispanics of Today (H.O.T.) & the Native American Student Association (NASA) bake sale fundraisers (2021-2022)

#### **ARTICLE 30. ACADEMIC MISCONDUCT**

Education at the university level requires intellectual integrity and trust between faculty and students. Professors are obliged to master their subject and present as fair an account of it as possible. For their part, students are obliged to make an honest effort to fulfill both the letter and the spirit of course requirements. Academic misconduct violates both integrity and trust. It jeopardizes the effectiveness of the educational process and the reliability of publicly reported records of achievement.

Academic misconduct by a student is defined as unethical activity associated with course work or grades.

### It includes, but is not limited to:

- Giving or receiving unauthorized aid on examinations.
- 2. Giving or receiving unauthorized aid in the preparation of notebooks, themes, reports, papers or any other assignments.
- 3. Submitting the same work for more than one course without the instructor's permission.
- 4. Plagiarism. Plagiarism is defined as using ideas or writings of another and claiming them as one's own. Copying any material directly (be it the work of other students, professors, or colleagues) or copying information from print or electronic sources (including the internet) without explicitly acknowledging the true source of the material is plagiarism. Plagiarism also includes paraphrasing another individuals' ideas or concepts without acknowledging their work, or contribution.
- 5. Unless otherwise stated by the instructor, exams, quizzes, and out-of-class assignments are meant to be individual, rather than group, work. Hence, copying from other students' quizzes or exams, as well as presenting as one's own work an assignment prepared wholly or in part by another is in violation of academic honesty.

The above guidelines do not preclude group study for exams, sharing of sources for research projects, or students discussing their ideas with other members of the class unless explicitly prohibited by the instructor. Since the violation of academic honesty strikes at the heart of the educational process, it is subject to the severest sanctions, up to and including receiving an "F" or "XF" (an "XF" indicates the "F" was the result of academic dishonesty) for the entire class or dismissal from the university.

When an instructor has a reasonable good faith belief that a student(s) has committed academic misconduct, that instructor, in accordance with their course syllabus, has the sole discretion to give the student an F on the assignment/test to which the student committed academic misconduct or an F for the entire course. If an instructor's response to alleged academic misconduct negatively affects the student's final grade in the course, that student(s) may appeal the final grade pursuant to the current Pittsburg State University Catalog's Grade Appeal process.

When the instructor wishes to impose an "XF", and/or more severe sanctions, he or she must first notify their department chair, dean, and the University's Academic Honesty Committee Chairperson via the institution's online academic misconduct form. In addition, the same procedure applies if similar sanctions seem warranted for a student(s) or former student(s) who have assisted in acts of academic misconduct.

For any Pittsburg State University Discipline proceedings, the "preponderance of evidence" standard of proof will be utilized. A preponderance of evidence standard evaluates whether it is more likely than not, based on the evidence available, that a violation occurred.

#### **University Academic Honesty Committee**

The Academic Honesty Committee is convened under the auspices of the Provost. It is composed of nine members. The Faculty Senate Executive Committee is responsible for appointing six of these members. All must be full-time members of the teaching faculty. Members chosen by the Executive Committee serve staggered two-year terms. The Faculty Senate Executive Committee shall make its appointments at the beginning of the academic year. In addition to its six faculty members, the Academic Honesty Committee shall include three student members. Two (2) students shall be appointed by the Student Government Association. An additional (1) student shall be appointed by the Graduate Student Association. The students from both organizations will be appointed annually and at the beginning of the Fall semester.

The Vice President of the Faculty Senate will serve as the Academic Honesty Committee Chairperson. If the Vice President of the Faculty Senate is excluded because of possible bias, the President of the Faculty Senate will appoint a temporary chair. The Academic Honesty Committee Chairperson is responsible for communicating with the Provost on cases involving alleged student academic misconduct.

The committee may impose one or more of the following sanction(s):

- The imposition of a grade of "XF"
- Request the Office of Student Rights and Responsibilities place the student on Disciplinary Probation
- Specifically Defined Sanctions. Specific conditions given to the student, or student
  organization, examples include limitations placed on behavior, revocation of privileges, or an
  active obligation to complete a specified action, such as campus/community service,
  participate in educational programs, etc.
- Suspension. Suspension is a temporary disciplinary separation from the University involving
  denial of all student privileges. Suspension shall be effective on the date of notice of the
  suspension or later if so stated in the notice, and shall prescribe the date and conditions upon
  which the student may petition for readmission. Conditions for readmission may include, but
  are not limited to, disciplinary probation for a specified length of time; nonresident on
  campus; restricted visitation to specified University facilities; and a written statement from an
  accredited mental health professional or medical doctor verifying the capability of the student
  to function successfully at the University. Students separated from the University by
  suspension may not enter the University premises or University-related premises without
  securing prior approval from the Vice President for Student Life.
- Expulsion from the university. Expulsion is permanent disciplinary separation from the
  University involving denial of all student privileges. Expulsion shall be effective on the date of
  notice of the expulsion, or later if so stated in the notice. Students separated from the
  University by expulsion may not enter the University premises or University-related premises
  without securing prior approval from the Vice President for Student Life.

The decision made by the Academic Honesty Committee may be appealed to the Provost. The following procedures shall be adhered to:

- Step 1: The instructor charging a student with academic misconduct shall submit a written request for more severe sanctions to the Chairperson of the Academic Honesty Committee, giving full detail of the alleged act(s) of academic misconduct and send copies of the request to their department chair and dean. The Chairperson of the Academic Honesty Committee will inform the Campus Judicial Officer and the other members of the details of the incident. The Campus Judicial Officer will contact the student and provide information on the student's rights, the allegations, and the procedures related to the Academic Misconduct Hearing. The Chairperson shall then schedule a hearing to be held within fifteen (15) business days from the time of the instructor's request. If the request occurs at the end of a semester, or after a semester has concluded, the Chairperson will schedule a hearing within 15 days of the start of the new semester (excluding June and July Summer Sessions).
- Step 2: The instructor, and student(s) charged with academic misconduct, will be notified of the time and date of the said hearing at least five (5) class days before the hearing is to be held. The instructor, and student(s) charged with academic misconduct may seek advice concerning the hearing from any person such as a faculty member or department chairperson. The instructor and each student(s) may also be accompanied to the hearing by an advisor of their choice. All hearings are record for future reference, only the University recording is

deemed official. Note: The university attorney has the right to be present at any Academic Honesty Committee hearing.

The two parties, the instructor and student(s) charged with academic misconduct, may each request removal of any one member of the committee. This request shall be presented to the Chairperson of the committee in writing at least two (2) class days prior to the time of the hearing. After the request for removal has been made the chairperson will notify the individual and the respective individual will be removed from the hearing. In order to establish a quorum, there must be a minimum of five (5) committee members, excluding the Chairperson present. At least one of those must be a student appointed by their governing body.

• Step 3: The Academic Honesty Committee will conduct an appropriate hearing and may gather additional evidence pertaining to the issue.

During the hearing, the instructor, student(s) charged with academic misconduct, and witnesses with direct first-hand knowledge of the incident shall have the opportunity to testify (within the guidelines and time frames established by the committee). Hearings are administrative proceedings not legal proceedings. Cross-examination is the prerogative of the instructor, the student(s) charged with academic misconduct, and the committee. During the entire process the proceedings of the committee shall be closed and confidential, unless the matter becomes the subject of litigation.

- Step 4: Within five (5) business days of the conclusion of the hearing, the committee will render a written opinion concerning its findings, as well as a written decision to the Campus Judicial Officer. The Campus Judicial Officer will disseminate the information to the student, faculty, and appropriate University departments.
- Step 5: Upon notification of the imposed sanction, the student(s) will have five (5) business days to appeal to the Provost. This appeal must be in a written format and must provide detail for the reason of the appeal.
- Step 6: Once the Provost receives the appeal, he/she will have 10 business days to review the hearing and, in consultation with the President, render a decision. The Provost may uphold, or overturn the Academic Honesty Committee's sanction(s) or propose an alternate penalty which the student may accept.

#### Removal of Sanctions

After two (2) years have elapsed, the student may present a written request for removal of the imposed sanctions to the Provost. If the request is not granted, the student may present up to 4 more requests for removal but in no case can the student present more than 1 request per year academic year.

If the request is granted, the student may be returned to good standing with the university and/or have the notification of the disciplinary action removed from their transcript, provided that no other sanction for academic dishonesty has been imposed in the interim. It shall be at the Provost's discretion to determine what fairness requires.

#### Faculty Senate report, April 2022.

1. Returned 8 proposals for a Pathway course to the departments to include pathway information.

2. Discovered there were no guidelines for what was needed to be included in a syllabus, so we developed a template to assist in future submissions. See below.

3. We are investigating a future Pitt Pathway web page or modification of current pages. As it currently stands information is scattered. See below, suggestion for a Pitt Pathway web page or a link on the Pathway page.

 After consultation with the College of Technology faculty it was decided to recommend removing GT 190 from the PSP list, not the deletion of the course completely.

This would be for discussion and voting. This is a 2-credit hour course and leaves students 1 credit short in the Pathway requirements. The course is actually for students on the old General Education package and has been replaced for the Pathway with a 3-credit course, GT 210 Technology in the World Today.

5. It should be noted that a procedural process is in place to guide people on where to submit courses.

"Once approved by the College Curriculum, any legislation that needs Teacher Education Council approval are then sent to that committee. Then returned to College Admins. ## University Undergraduate Curriculum Subcommittee Annual Report 2021-2022

The Pittsburg State University Undergraduate Curriculum Subcommittee was active for the 2021-2022 academic year.

For this academic year, the committee held nine meetings, eight four were held in the fall and five were held in the spring. In preparation for hearings, committee members reviewed all items of proposed legislation submitted for review by the committee. During committee meetings, committee members discussed the proposed changes and identified corrections in the proposed legislation, where necessary. The committee considered and approved a total of 123 curriculum changes during the academic year.

The faculty members on the committee for 2021-2022 academic year included: Dr. Mary Jo Goedeke, Dr. Mike Carper, Ms. Krissy Lewis, and Dr. Ram Gupta. Dr. Karen Johnson served as a member Ex-Officio. Students on this committee included: Devyn Pitts. Melinda Roelfs and Michelle Hensley also attended meetings.

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- 3.—Submitting the same work for more than one course without the instructor's permission, and

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members of the teaching faculty. Members chosen by the Executive Committee serve staggered two-year terms. The Faculty Senate Executive Committee shall make its appointments at the beginning of the academic year. In addition to its six faculty members, the Academic Honesty Committee shall include three student members. Two (2) students of senior status shall be appointed by the Student Government Association. An additional (1) student shall be appointed by the Graduate Student Association. The students from both organizations will be appointed annually and at the beginning of the Fall semester.

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The committee may impose one or more of the following sanction(s):

- The imposition of a grade of "XF"
- The addition of a permanent note on the student's transcript indicating his/her participation in a serious act of academic dishonesty (such as taking an exam for another student)
- Disciplinary Academic probation
- Specifically Defined sanctions Specific conditions given to the student, or student organization, examples
  include limitations placed on behavior, revocation of privileges, or an active obligation to complete a
  specified action, such as campus/community service, participate in educational programs, etc. as listed in
  Article 34.
- Suspension, Suspension is a temporary disciplinary separation from the University involving denial of all student privileges. Suspension shall be effective on the date of notice of the suspension or later if so stated in the notice, and shall prescribe the date and conditions upon which the student may petition for readmission. Conditions for readmission may include, but are not limited to, disciplinary probation for a specified length of time; nonresident on campus; restricted visitation to specified University facilities; and a written statement from an accredited mental health professional or medical doctor verifying the capability of the student to function successfully at the University. Students separated from the University by suspension may not enter the University premises or University-related premises without securing prior approval from the Vice President for Student Life.
- Expulsion from the university. Expulsion is permanent disciplinary separation from the University involving denial of
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  notice. Students separated from the University by expulsion may not enter the University premises or Universityrelated premises without securing prior approval from the Vice President for Student Life.

The decision made by the Academic Honesty Committee may be appealed to the Provost, The following procedures shall be adhered to:

- Step 1: The instructor charging a student with academic dishonesty misconduct shall submit a written request for hearing more severe sanctions to the Chairperson of the Academic Honesty Committee, giving full detail of the alleged act(s) of academic dishonesty misconduct and send copies of the request to their department chair and dean. The Chairperson of the Academic Honesty Committee will then convene the committee and inform its inform the Campus Judicial Officer and the other members of the details of the incident. The aforementioned request shall be forwarded by the Chairperson of the Academic Honesty Committee to the student(s) charged with academic dishonesty EThe Campus Judicial Officer will contact the student and provide information on the student's rightss and, the allegations, and the procedures related to the Academic Misconduct Hearing. The committee Chairperson shall then schedule a hearing to be held within fifteen (15) class business days from the time of the instructor's request. If the request occurs at the end of a semester, or after a semester has concluded, the Chairperson will schedule a hearing within shall occur within 15 days of the start of the new semester (excluding June and July Summer Sessions....
  - Step 1 should include a statement about the student and faculty receiving the academic misconduct Hearing

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#### Procedures.

Step 2: The instructor, and student(s) charged with academic <u>dishonesty misconduct</u>, will be notified of the time and date of the said hearing at least five (5) class days before the hearing is to be held. The instructor, and student(s) charged with academic <u>dishonesty misconduct</u> may seek advice concerning the hearing from any person such as a faculty member or department chairperson. The instructor and each student(s) may also be accompanied to the hearingsby an advisor <u>of their choice</u>. <u>The student(s)</u>, at their own cost, has the right toprovide a transcriptionist at their hearing. All hearings are record for future reference, only the University recording is deemed official. Note: The university attorney has the right to be present at any Academic Honesty Committee hearing.

The two parties, the instructor and student(s) charged with academic dishonestymisconduct, may each request removal of any one member of the committee. This request shall be presented to the Cehairperson of the committee in writingat least two (2) class days prior to the time of the hearing. After the request for removal has been made the chairperson will notify the individual and the respective individual will be removed from the hearing. In order to establish a quorum, there must be a minimum of five (5) committee members, excluding the Chairperson present. At least one of those must be a student appointed by their governing body.

 Step 3: The Academic Honesty Committee will conduct an appropriate hearing and may gather additional evidence pertaining to the issue.

During the hearing, the instructor, student(s) charged with academic dishonesty misconduct, and witnesses with direct firsthand knowledge of the incident shall have the opportunity to testify (within the guidelines and time frames established by the committee). Hearings are evaluations by members of the university community and are administrative proceedings not \( \frac{1}{4} \)

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
legal proceedings. Cross-examination is the prerogative of the instructor, the student(s) charged with academic dishonesty misconduct, and the committee. For future reference, the hearing shall be audio tape recorded (Committee deliberations on sanctions shall not be recorded). During the entire process the proceedings of the committee shallbe closed and confidential, unless the matter becomes the subject of litigation.

- Step 4: Within five (5) <u>class business</u> days of the conclusion of the hearing, the committee will render a
  written opinionconcerning its findings, as well as a written <u>verdict</u> which the Provost will impose decision to
  the Campus Judicial Officer. The Campus Judicial Officer will disseminate the information to the student, and faculty, and appropriate University departments.
- Step 5: Upon notification of the imposed sanction, the student(s) will have five (5) class business days to
  appeal to the Provost. This appeal must be in a written format and must provide detail for the reason of the
  appeal.
- Step 6: Once the Provost receives the appeal, he/she will have & class 10 business days to review the hearing
  and, in consultation with the President, render a decision. The Provost may uphold, or overturn the Academic
  HonestyCommittee's sanction(s) or propose an alternate penalty which the student may accept.

#### Removal of Sanctions

After two (2) years have elapsed, the student may present a written request for removal of the imposed sanctions to the Provost. If the request is not granted, the student may present up to 4 more requests for removal but in no case can the student present more than 1 request per year academic year.

If the request is granted, the student will be may be returned to good standing with the university and /or have the notification of the disciplinary action removed from their transcript, provided that no other sanction for academic dishonesty has been imposed in the interim. It shall be at the Provost's discretion to determine what fairness requires.

Rationale for Change (include changes to curriculum objectives):

The current version of the EXSCI program was implemented in the W/F 2013. It experienced a major overhaul just two years after its original implentation in the W/F 2011. The reason for the overhaul was the ever changing field of EXSCI and the need to include more rigorous and hands-on experiences for university students. The changes being requested in this application will once again allow the EXSCI program to adjust to the environment of higher education and allow us to recruit a previously neglected population of university students interested in the Strength and Conditioning, sport performance, and general fitness fields. These changes will allow the EXSCI program to offer students an educational experience in a very well established area of study and/or career paths in strength and conditioning, sport performance, and/or fitness. Also, the addition of official emphasis areas will allow students to be recognized, on their diploma and transcripts, as having completed a specific area of study in Exercise Science.

Our current curriculum objective is to produce top-caliber graduates who can contribute to the body of knowledge in the fight against diseases associated with inactivity, sedentary behavior and/or unhealthy lifestyles.

Our future curriculum objectives will be to produce top-caliber graduates who can act as competent practitioners and: 1) contribute to the body of knowledge in the fight against diseases associated with inactivity, sedentary behavior. and/or unhealthy lifestyles, and/or

2) contribute to the fields of strength and conditioning, sports performance, and fitness to enhance the lives of athletes, recreational athletes, and/or the general nublic


