# FACULTY SENATE MINUTES October 31, 2022

The Pittsburg State University Faculty Senate met at 3:00 p.m. on Monday, October 31st, 2022, with Karen Johnson, President, presiding.

#### Past Minutes

Minutes from the September 26th, 2022 meeting were approved.

## **Announcements**

Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs – Dr. Howard Smith

Provost Smith shared that there are plans to repurpose Apple Day. (A handout was provided describing the new plan.) Faculty were encouraged to contact Abby Fern to provide feedback. Current KBOR projects include rpk with a report expected in December; NISS including moving forward with centralized advising; data dashboards for tracking KBOR initiatives; and systemwide General Education. Provost Smith announced that the Transition Advisory Council website is now available and includes the most recent presentations. In addition, Dr. Shipp has been hosting student forums and will likely meet with 600-700 students over the course of the semester. Several projects are currently being discussed in Academic Affairs. These include a new Strategic Enrollment Management plan and an Academic Programs Strategic plan; moving forward with NISS recommendations and beginning reviews of student holds and DFW reports. (Previously DFW reports had not been shared out with deans and chairs.)

PSU/KNEA -Khamis Siam, President

Dr. Siam shared that the committee met with the Administration on October 14<sup>th</sup>. Negotiations will resume once a College Dean has been confirmed.

Unclassified Professional Senate - Tammy Higgins, President

It was reported that the Docking Institution satisfaction survey results would be released to campus and across the state on Tuesday, November 1<sup>st</sup>.

It was shared that the results from the Docking Institution satisfaction survey results would be shared with the Transition Advisory Council for discussion.

Faculty Senate President - Karen Johnson, President

President Johnson reiterated the Apple Day information shared by Provost Smith. President Johnson also shared that there is rpk project information on the KBOR website with an option for folks to provide feedback. Faculty were encouraged to review the information available. President Johnson has invited Dr. Shipp to a Faculty Senate meeting. Instead of attending a meeting, he may want to host a reception in December. Details will be provided once confirmed. Faculty Senate is partnering with Graduate Council to discuss the recent college reorganizations and how they impact each group's Constitution.
