# FACULTY SENATE MINUTES February 24, 2020

The Pittsburg State University Faculty Senate met at 3:00 p.m. on Monday, February 24, 2020 in the Sunflower Room of the Overman Student Center with Kevin Bracker, President, presiding.

### **Past Minutes**

Minutes from the January 27, 2020 meeting were approved.

### **Announcements**

Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs - Dr. Howard Smith

Dr. Smith reported that the system Provosts met recently with the KBOR. Discussion topics included improving transfer from community colleges to the universities and reviewing strategic alignment of programs even across institutions (minima numbers for all six universities were shared). In addition, the House has recommended including salary dollars for the Regents institution in the budget, although the dollars were not included in the Governor's budget. Lastly, all of the RPK groups will be convening including the prototype teams from Phase I. Academic support services are being examined in addition to academic colleges/departments as retirements have been announced by Dr. Kahol and Dr. Frieden. Dr. Smith will report to the KBOR in April our progress with the strategic visioning process. The process requires a cultural shift in the way minima, sustainability and budgets are viewed and managed.

PSU/KNEA -Grant Moss, President

Dr. Bracker thinks the Honors College committee would be the group to work on this project. Dr. Smith mentioned that he has some data that can be shared with the committee.
