

FACULTY SENATE MINUTES
March 28, 2022

The Pittsburg State University Faculty Senate met at 3:00 p.m. on Monday, March 28th, 2022, with Shawnee Hendershot, President, presiding.

Past Minutes

Minutes from the February 28th, 2022 meeting were approved.

Announcements

Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs – Dr. Howard Smith

It was reported that PSU's proposal for a BBA in Business Studies will be on the KBOR April agenda. The National Institute for Student Success (NISS) is wrapping up their report for KBOR and the participating schools. Four areas have been highlighted for PSU by the NISS: 1) financial aid specialization especially for Pell recipients, 2) centralized advising with increased coordination, 3) transition services for changing majors, and 4) improvements in data availability. In addition, KBOR is working on a space utilization update to assist in improving efficiencies. Lastly, the implementation for the new financial aid system has begun.

PSU/KNEA –Khamis Siam, President

It was shared that officer elections would be happening soon. In addition, the KNEA bargaining unit recently participated in bargaining training. Faculty were encouraged to check with the CTLT regarding submission of completion certificates for the PD training.

Student Senate – Kaedra Brenner, Representative

It was reported that the Big Event is scheduled for April 2nd. The Student Government Association just concluded elections for next year. Student Government Association participated in Higher Education Day in Topeka and discussed the following: mental health and higher education funding, and recruitment and retention.

Unclassified Professional Senate – Mary Jo Meier, President

It was announced that the committee met on March 2nd with Provost Smith as the guest speaker. During the Apple Day ceremony, Becky Kraus and Barb Barto were announced as the VOYA award recipients. The committee is currently working on elections; the ballot is planned to go out April 4th. In addition, the survey from the Docking Institution should be released on April 6th. The next meeting is scheduled for April 6th with Shawn Naccarato as guest speaker.

University Support Staff – Terry Pierce, President

Faculty Senate President – Shawnee Hendershot, President

It was shared that increasing the AP cut score for English from a 3 to a 4 would be voted on by COCAO (the Regents Chief Academic Officers) at their next meeting. The initial concern raised was that students who receive credit for English Composition based on a score of a 3 have not demonstrated a level of learning necessary to be successful in higher level English courses. The data reviewed by PSU showed the contrary. In addition, Freedom of Expression statements will be presented at the April KBOR meeting. The KBOR rpk project is underway and will focus on program demand, duplication and efficiency across the system. It was stressed by the Regents that this project is meant to be a flashlight and not a hammer and they understand that each campus has their own culture. (PSU's previous rpk report can be found on Canvas under Strategic Visioning. Faculty may contact the CTLT if they need the information added to their Canvas.) Lastly, Dr. Scott will be attending the April Faculty Senate meeting.
