GRADUATE COUNCIL MINUTES Wednesday, May 9, 2007

Dr. Snyder explained there are a variety of ways catalog descriptions of courses such as readings, special investigations, special topics and seminars could be interpreted. Such courses offer the opportunity to teach one specific topic area or a different topic/title for individual students. She questioned whether the council expects to see topic areas listed for such courses when Graduate Service Recommendations are filled out or whether it is the discretion of the Chair to decide that a certain person has the capability to teach a topic area. Dr. Daley stated that readings courses can be about anything and the department does not always know in advance what specific topic area a student will want to study. Dr. Howard Smith stated that a Chair should be able to make the decision. Dr. Allan stated she agreed with Dr. Smith, however, having the Graduate Council approve such decisions creates a system of checks and balances to prevent a circumstance that could reflect poorly on the entire university. Dr. Snyder stated that some content areas could be listed as a specialty area for a certain instructor. Dr. Sours stated that such courses should get approval from the Graduate Council and that Chairs should not have blanket authority at the risk of harming the graduate programs. Dr. Daley stated he would agree with specifying content areas to be taught by a specific individual, but not specific topics. The motion was made that departments submitting faculty service approval for instructors teaching a course that is a readings, topics, investigation or seminar that will be individualized for each student enrolled will be required to specify the category/area(s) the instructor will be allowed to supervise.
