Dr. Ward was present to explain that the Revision of Course requests have been brought forward to meet state requirements, add the IP grade as an option and clean up a course title.

Dr. George was present to explain that the course is being changed to an 800 level course in order to meet graduate school requirements for 800 level courses within the Special Education Teaching program.

Dr. Ward moved for approval, Dr. Roberts seconded and the motion carried.

Old Business:

Incomplete Work/In-Progress (policy addendum)

Dr. Snyder explained that draft 2 was presented with the agenda and draft 1 has been added for consideration. Draft 1 is meant to be consistent with wording from the current policy. After some discussion, Dr. Snyder suggested that she will re-work draft 1 and bring it back to Council for review.

Students Returning After Absence (new policy)

This was withdrawn from the agenda. It was decided the Deans will need to discuss this topic before it comes to Council for approval. Dr. Snyder explained that the Deans were unaware that the validation of coursework policy had changed several years ago.

Proposed revisions to Graduate Council program/course forms

Dr. Snyder stated that feedback on the forms has been mostly positive. She questioned whether the Council would like to see changes in course description come through for approval or notification only. The Council agreed they should come for approval, so course descriptions will be moved from the notification only form to the revision of course form. Dr. Snyder also stated that, once the forms are signed by the Graduate Council Chairperson, the forms will be returned to the department for their own tracking purposes. The new forms will now be posted to the Graduate Council website for use.

Dr. Willard moved for approval with the change noted, Dr. Williamson seconded and the motion carried.

Fundraising agenda (tabled from October meeting) – Dr. Jones

Dr. Jones stated that many graduate programs have difficulty retaining large numbers of students and he believes being able to offer more graduate assistantships will help attract more students to the programs. In researching this topic, he has learned that if departments can come up with the \$5,000 stipend for a teaching assistantship, their tuition can be waived. He stated that he is calling attention to this to start conversation within departments. He also stated that an endowment can be created for this specific purpose and/or departments can include assistantships on their department wish list through Development. Dr. Sandford inquired whether the University would be willing to match any funds raised. Dr. Snyder explained that, while the University will not match any funds raised, they will match by waiving tuition. Dr. Jones asked that a note representing the Council be sent to the chairs and college development staff. Dr. Snyder offered to draft a letter.

Dr. Willard moved for approval, Dr. Kuehn seconded and the motion carried.

New Business:

Proposal for IKE Certificate

Dr. Zagorski was present to discuss this issue. He explained that the IKE Certificate was created to encourage an International focus among students and was approved by the Faculty Senate at the time it was developed. It was originally conceived to be an undergraduate program but the committee has been approached to make it eligible for graduate students as well. In examining this possibility, the committee established guidelines for how a graduate student could meet the requirements for the certificate. Dr. Willard inquired who is responsible for the administration of the certificate. Dr. Zagorski stated the International office is responsible. Dr. Ward stated that the program should be left as is because it is not truly a part of any graduate program. Dr. Snyder suggested that

programs with an interest in International issues/studies could bring their own request to allow the certificate for their students to Council for approval. It was decided that more discussion on this topic is needed.

Dr. Willard moved to table this request, Dr. Jones seconded and the motion carried.

Suspending MA Art programs – Dr. Snyder

Dr. Snyder added this item to the agenda. She explained that the Art department has decided to suspend admitting students to their MA programs, effective immediately. At this time, they are opting to put more efforts into reviewing their undergraduate programs. They are communicating with current students to help them make plans to complete their program. This suspension will come to Council for approval in December.
