New Business:

Thesis Committee Requirements – Dr. Dresner

Dr. Dresner explained that History often selects the faculty from Social Sciences as the outside member on thesis committees. Now that these two departments are merging, they will no longer be allowed to use the Social Sciences faculty as outside committee members under current thesis committee policy. He proposed replacing the wording of the policy from "one of which is outside the department..." to "one of which is outside the program...". Several on the Council questioned why other faculty members from around campus cannot be used to fill the outside member role, given that the outside member is not required to have knowledge of the thesis topic. Dr. Snyder stated that any student with an established committee at the time of the departmental merger would be allowed to continue. After much discussion, it was decided to leave the policy as is.

Retired Faculty Serving on Thesis

Dr. Snyder explained that years ago, when a faculty member resigned or retired, their name was removed from the records and they could not be selected to serve on a thesis committee. In our current system, people do not leave the list when they retire. Some departments have asked these names be removed; however, there are many cases where these same people return to teach, and are then eligible to be put back on the list. Snyder asked the Council if they felt tenured faculty members that had already been approved by the Council should be removed or remain on the list when they resign/retire. Council

members agreed to continue allowing retired/resigned past members to continue to serve on thesis committees.

Enrollment numbers for 10/WF

This was given as information to the Council members and their departments. As an information point, Dr. Snyder pointed out that the majority (65%) of current graduate students at PSU are age 30 and under.

Dr. Willard moved to adjourn, Dr. Jayawardhana seconded the motion carried.
