Certificate Programs

Dr. Kahol provided a description of the certificate working document and an explanation of financial aid qualifications for students pursing a certificate.

University Catalog Graduate School International Students statement:

To satisfy the proof of Language Proficiency, international students can either submit a TOEFL or IELTS score result or provide official documentation that the undergraduate degree was taught in the English language (for countries that do not require the TOEFL).

Dr. Kahol explained his interpretation of the catalog statement and there was a brief discussion about the statement.
