Business:

Approval of 2016 Winter/Fall Graduates

The Graduate Faculty convened to approve the graduates: Dr. Baack moved to approve the Winter/Fall graduates contingent on them meeting the degree requirements, Dr. Kuehn seconded and the motion carried.

Dr. Baack moved to adjourn the Graduate Faculty meeting, Dr. Hudiburg seconded and the motion carried.

The minutes of the November 2016 meeting were approved with no corrections.

Dr. Warner moved for approval, Dr. Dresner seconded and the motion carried.

Dr. Bachner made a clarification to the October 2016 minutes regarding the deletion of the MS Counseling Clinical Mental Health Counseling emphasis. She clarified that this emphasis was not deleted due to low enrollment, it was being deleted due to the expense of the accreditation process and because Dr. Don Ward who served as the program advisor for this emphasis is retiring.

Dr. Hudiburg moved to approve the clarification to the October minutes, Dr. Lambeth seconded and the motion carried.

Dr. Flood mentioned that both recommendations from Automotive Technology have the terminal degree that is listed in the Unclassified Handbook, but pointed out that the

requirements listed are specific to those individuals teaching undergraduate courses not master's courses.

Dr. Flood moved to approve the Automotive Technology recommendations, Dr. Kuehn seconded and the motion carried.

Christine Brodsky Biology

There was discussion regarding what should be considered comparable experience. Dr. Flood mentioned that experience as a graduate assistant or an adjunct usually does not count. Dr. Dresner mentioned that being an adjunct should count because adjuncts typically advise students. Dr. Kahol stated that comparable experience could be through teaching or research and that both Biology recommendations had research experience. Dr. Nonnenmacher mentioned that the Biology recommendations wanted to lead masters students with research not just serve on committee's and that faculty have research obligations that start from the beginning and that he feels that the language on the form should be changed.

Dr. Baack moved for approval, Dr. Hudiburg seconded, and the motion carried. Dr. Flood opposed. Dr. Nonnenmacher and Dr. Bachner abstained.

Dr. Frisbee stated that she holds the same degree as both recommendations.
