Reminder To Update Your Beneficiary

Remember to keep your beneficiaries up to date!

For employees under Kansas Public Employees Retirement System (KPERS), you may view your retirement and life insurance beneficiaries on the KPERS website at KPERS Login.

For the KPERS 457 Voluntary Plan, you may view your beneficiaries at **KPERS 457 Voluntary Login.**

For employees under the Kansas Board of Regents (KBOR), you may request to view your current beneficiaries by contacting the HRS office by phone at 620-235-4191 or by emailing payroll@pittstate.edu.

Flexible Spending Accounts (FSA) beneficiary information can be viewed by logging into the FSA portal **here.**

Health Savings Account (HSA) beneficiary information can be viewed by logging into your **Metlife account** and then going to accounts - profile - profile summary - beneficiary - add beneficiary.

For VOYA participants you can log on to your account and **change it online** or call VOYA at 1-800-584-6001

For TIAA participants you can log on to your account and **change it online** or call TIAA at 1-800-732-8353.



2024 Open Enrollment Ahead

The State Employee Health Plan (SEHP) will host the annual Open Enrollment period for Active State and Non-State Group employees from **October 1-31, 2023.** Benefits are effective January 1 1, 2024., 2024.

All Open Enrollment materials, including the Open Enrollment Guide, videos, and informational flyers will be posted to the SEHP's website at https://sehp.healthbenefitsprogram.ks.gov/ by September 15, 2023.

All retirees will be mailed a hard copy. They do not need to request one.

Important Student Employee Information

Line Managers: Review your direct reports and take appropriate steps to request the termination of employees in a timely manner. Use the Employee Change Request Form (found in GUS Cloud > Other > My Dashboard) to terminate student and temporary, hourly-paid employees.

Beginning with the week of **August 21, 2023** students cannot work over 20 hours per week. Exceptions to this policy must be approved by the Division Head, Vice President, or President if President's Division.

As you are appointing new students for the upcoming year, it is important to review the information about when student employees can start working once they have completed their paperwork in Student Employment (located in Career Development in Horace Mann).

- Students cannot begin working until they have completed their information with Student Employment and the file has been given to HRS for processing.
- Only one student can be assigned to a position number.
- If you do not have enough vacant positions, please send a request to
 <u>payroll@pittstate.edu</u>. Be sure to include the job description and the line manager information.

Late Timesheets

Late (paper) timesheets should be uploaded (completed and signed) to the **electronic submissions form**. Please **DO NOT** email them to payroll.

You can access the form here on the <u>HRS' Forms Webpage</u> (Supervisors we HIGHLY recommend you bookmark this page.)

By submitting late timesheets to the electronic submission form it better allows us to keep track of the timesheets so that employees can be paid in a timely manner.

Supervisors please remember that you need to be checking the late timesheets before signing them. We are receiving quite a few with inaccurate calculations or missing information such as the pay period date. This can result in employees not being paid.
