Monday, September 4 was Labor Day and the University was closed. See the Holiday Reporting Guidelines below.

Labor Day Time Reporting Guidelines

• Salaried employees with benefits:

Unclassified

- If you DO work on the Holiday, you will report Comp Time Earned for the numbers of hours that you worked.
 - Example: If you worked 8 hours, you will report 8 hours of Comp Time Earned.
- If you DO NOT work on the Holiday, you will not report anything.

University Support Staff (USS):

- If you DO work on the Holiday, report Comp Time Earned on your timecard for one and one-half times the hours worked.
 - Example: If you worked 8 hours then you would report Comp Time Earned as 12 hours.
- If you DO NOT work on the Holiday, then you will not report anything.

• Hourly Employees with Benefits:

Unclassified

- If you DO work on the Holiday, you will report Regular time for hours worked.
- If you DO NOT work on the Holiday, you will report Holiday Credit for your schedule on the Holiday.

University Support Staff (USS)

- If you DO work on the Holiday, you will report Regular time for hours worked.
- If you DO NOT work on the Holiday, you will report Holiday Credit for your regular schedule.

• <u>Discretionary Day Information:</u>

- You can use the 2023 discretionary day starting Tuesday, January 3, 2023.
- Discretionary day is available after 6 months of employment.

Reminder To Update Your Beneficiary

Remember to keep your beneficiaries up to date!

For employees under Kansas Public Employees Retirement System (KPERS), you may view your retirement and life insurance beneficiaries on the KPERS website at KPERS Login.

For the KPERS 457 Voluntary Plan, you may view your beneficiaries at **KPERS 457 Voluntary Login**.

For employees under the Kansas Board of Regents (KBOR), you may request to view your current beneficiaries by contacting the HRS office by phone at 620-235-4191 or by emailing payroll@pittstate.edu.

Flexible Spending Accounts (FSA) beneficiary information can be viewed by logging into the FSA portal **here.**

Health Savings Account (HSA) beneficiary information can be viewed by logging into your <u>Metlife account</u> and then going to accounts - profile - profile summary - beneficiary - add beneficiary.

For TIAA participants you can log on to your account and **change it online** or call TIAA at 1-800-732-8353.

Get your HealthQuest points before it is too late! I'm repeating this story from March! I told you I would be personally tracking how long it takes for HealthQuest points to appear in our new Marathon Health portal. Here is the update on how long it took for points to show up: Dentist – 7 calendar days; lab work – 23 calendar days; annual physical – 19 calendar days; mammogram – 19 calendar days. I've done a couple of online learning events and signed up for RX Savings so I already have my total of 40 points required for the year! It is not hard!

Another example: Madisyn Hite, HR Specialist, has not been to any appointments and already has her 40 points. She participated in multiple EAP and Marathon Health learning events, signed up and worked with a Health Coach (someone please ask her about her broccoli goal \odot), and also signed up for Rx Savings Solutions (that alone is 5 points!).

Remember, you receive a health insurance premium reduction of \$480/year for 2024 if you complete the 40 points. If you have the High Deductible Health Plan – Plan C or N (HDHP) along with the Health Savings Account (HSA), then you receive \$12.50 per point into your HSA – for another \$500 per year! Easy money.

State Employee Health Plan (SEHP) Open Enrollment: SEHP Open Enrollment is October 1-31. WATCH for emails from the State Employee Health Plan for updates and timing on open enrollment for your health, dental, vision, etc. for 2024. As in years past, this is an active enrollment meaning you HAVE TO ENTER THE MAP PORTAL and re-enroll every year. Watch for those emails – very important!
