## Pittsburg State University Writing Across the Curriculum

To earn the WL Best Practices stipend, faculty teaching a Writing to Learn course will submit documentation showing that the course meets best practices guidelines with particular items highlighted. Documentation should include

- ∇ the course syllabus (which will include the WL Statement of Intent and Philosophy of Writing),
- writing instructions (the assignment sheets designed to be handed out to students) for each type of formal writing assignment used in the course, and
- ∇ grading criteria (the information designed to be handed out to students) showing how each type of formal writing assignment will be evaluated.

## WL Best Practices checklist

- WL Statement of Intent and Philosophy of Writing.
- Writing and course grade (Is it clear that students must pass the writing component in order to pass the course?) Please highlight this in your syllabus.
- Amount of Writing (Is it clear from the page or word count requirements and number of formal
  writing assignments that the course requires a minimum of 7 or 12 pages of formal writing,
  depending on course level?) This will be determined by counting the minimum number of pages
  for all formal writing assignments.
- List of due dates (Are due dates for formal writing assignments stated?) Please highlight these dates in your syllabus.
- Instructions for writing assignments (Are instructions provided for each type of formal writing assignment students will do?)
- Grading criteria (Have you included your grading criteria for each type of formal writing assignment?) If this is not in a separate document, please highlight this in your syllabus.
- Explanation of how students will get feedback (Have you included a statement telling students how they will get feedback from you on their writing?) Please highlight this in your syllabus.
- Academic honesty statement (If any of your formal writing assignments allow or require sources, have you included a statement that students are required to cite their sources using a recognized source citation system?) Please highlight this in your syllabus.
