Happy Holidays, to all members of the extended Gorilla Battalion. I wanted to take a little time in middle of this festive season to update each of you on what has been going on with the Gorilla Cadets since the last news letter.

We had a very large senior class graduate between May and June; resulting in 22 new Gorilla 2nd Lieutenants being added to the force. Several have already headed off to and have competed or nearly completed Basic Officer Leadership Course.

For the current senior class, they maintain a standard of excellence at LDAC this past summer with again no overall "N" ratings. Our programs overall percentage of "E's" went up along with the number of RECONDO qualified cadets. The PSU cadets exceed the Cadet Command Standard in nearly all events.

Ranger Challenge is always a key event for the Gorillas and this year was no exception. This past October we sent two 9-male cadets team and one 5-female cadet team to Camp, Dodge Iowa. The 2 male teams competed in a pool of 20 total teams. Our "RED" team comprised heavily of Senior and Junior Cadets finished fourth overall, but first with Task Force Riley (KU, KSU, MOWest, and PSU). Our "GOLD" team comprised of mostly Sophomore and Freshmen cadets finished 10th. Our female team (Greybacks) finished 2nd amongst the 7 female teams.

All of our senior cadets assession into the component they wanted and each received no worse than their third branch choice. Of note, Cadet Paul Hartfield helped exemplify the quality of the Gorilla Battalion Cadets by accession as the 42nd highest rated cadet in a pool of nearly 5,800 cadets nationwide.

As for the staff it has also been a very busy time. We has yet again some personnel turnover. CPT Eric Hollingsworth completed his time with the program and was re-assigned within the Kansas National Guard and is now serving as the commander for all of the KSNG recruiter in southern Kansas. CPT Hollingsworth energy and excitement will be missed but his legacy of promoting the PSU Gorilla's will undoubtedly continue. Replacing him, is CPT Chad Murrow. CPT Murrow is diligently working to learn a new job and is now the programs enrollment and recruiting officer.

Additionally, after three great years training and mentoring young cadets, SFC Forrest Robertson PCS'd to Fort Stewart; returning to a cavalry troop. SFC Robertson had a true impact on this program from Ranger Challenge training to simple day-to-day hip-pocket counselings with cadets. SFC Robertson and his wife Marcie were key members of this command team and will be hard to replace.

Lastly, the cadre staff excelled this fall during the Command Inspection from our higher headquarters, 3rd ROTC BDE. The Gorilla Battalion met or exceeded requirements in every area of inspection. So while there can always be improvement the inspection validated that staff is highly dedicated and knows what they are doing for the program. Individuals of note in the inspection were SFC Robertson and Ms Shirley Beer, the Human Resource Administrator. Shirley is of course the key continuity part of the program and she received an "Outstanding" in all inspected areas.
