As always, we have made arrangements to present outstanding artists who will bring exceptional performances to the stage of McCray Hall's Sharon Kay Dean Recital Hall on six Friday evenings across the academic year.

The season will open in September with an interesting and creative program by the string trio, Black Oak Ensemble. We'll bring the season to a close with a highlyanticipated program of music by women composers, titled Web of Lace, featuring the Boston-based Tapestry Ensemble.

Black Oak Ensemble september 9, 2022

Praised for their "insightful, committed and masterful performances 10/10" (Classics Today) and their "fierce eloquence" (The Times, London), the Black Oak Ensemble is one of the most innovative and exciting chamber ensembles on the international stage.

The Black Oak Ensemble comprises GRAMMY-nominated violinist Desirée Ruhstrat, cellist David Cunliffe of the acclaimed Lincoln Trio, and violist Aurélien Fort Pederzoli, a founding member of the groundbreaking GRAMMY-nominated Spektral Quartet.

Black Oak performs regularly in recitals and festivals throughout the world. The ensemble's recently-released CD on the Cedille label, Avant l'orage, features French String Trios from 1926-1939.

The ensemble is named for the black oak, a beautiful tree native to its home state of Illinois.



Joseph Adam, organ October 14, 2022



Joseph Adam holds the position of Director of Music at Saint James Cathedral in Seattle. As Resident Organist at Benaroya Hall, he performs regularly with the Seattle Symphony; in recent seasons, he performed concertos by Handel and Hanson under the direction of Nicholas McGegan and Gerard Schwarz.

Mr. Adam is a prize winner in numerous competitions, including the prestigious St. Albans International Organ Competition. He was one of three organists invited to perform on the Rosales/Glatter-Götz organ at Disney Hall in Los Angeles as part of the 2004 National Convention of the American Guild of Organists, a performance that has been featured on the nationally-syndicated radio program Pipe Dreams.

A past dean of the Seattle chapter of the American Guild of Organists, he served as chair of the performances committee for the 2000 and 2022 national AGO conventions in Seattle.

arx duo November 11, 2022

arx duo is dedicated to the expansion of the percussion chamber music repertoire through the creation and presentation of new works, the educating and inspiring of young artists, and exciting performances inviting audiences to engage with new works and artists from all over the world. They have had premiere performances throughout the globe, conducted workshops on three continents, and worked with a variety of composers and artists to bring new creations to life for communities everywhere.

With a repertoire ranging from established masters to today's newest compositional voices, arx duo has worked closely with composers such as Jonathan Bailey Holland, Ted Hearne, Steven Mackey, Juri Seo, and many more.

The name "arx duo" comes from the artists' desire to forge new connections and artistic pathways or "arcs" within the genre, expanding the opportunities for their music to reach new audiences.





Peter Steiner, trombone January 20, 2023

Italian trombonist Peter
Steiner's playing has been
described as "beautifully
controlled with a vocal sound."
In 2019 he was honored as
a Prize Winner at the XVI
International Tchaikovsky
Competition in Russia.

At the age of 23, Peter Steiner was appointed Trombonist of the Vienna State Opera and Vienna Philharmonic for the 2016-2017 season. Prior to that engagement he



served as Principal Trombonist with the Colorado Symphony for the 2014-2015 season. He has performed as guest trombonist with the Munich Philharmonic, Staatskapelle Dresden, New York Philharmonic, Dallas Symphony Orchestra, Seattle Symphony Orchestra and BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra.

Mr. Steiner has collaborated with pianist/organist Constanze Hochwartner in a number of CD recordings for the Berlin Classics label.

Calidore String Quartet -

The Calidore String Quartet has been praised by the *New York Times* for its "deep reserves of virtuosity and irrepressible dramatic instinct."

Highlights of recent seasons have included performances in major venues throughout North America, Europe, and Asia such as Carnegie Hall, Wigmore Hall, Kennedy Center, Berlin Konzerthaus, Brussels BOZAR, Cologne Philharmonie, Seoul's Kumho Arts Hall, and at significant festivals including the BBC Proms, Verbier, Ravinia, Mostly Mozart, Music@Menlo, Rheingau, East Neuk, and Festspiele Mecklenburg-Vorpommern.

The Calidore String Quartet was founded at the Colburn School in Los Angeles in 2010. Within two years, the quartet won grand prizes in virtually all the major US chamber music competitions. An amalgamation of "California" and "doré" (French for "golden"), the ensemble's name represents its reverence for the diversity of culture and the strong support it received from its original home: Los Angeles, California, the "golden state."

For this joyous concert, singers Cristi Catt, Daniela Tosic, and Deborah Rentz-Moore join forces with violist Rachel Jayson, and pianist Noriko Yasuda in a program that mixes













every possible combination of voice, viola, and piano.
