Thank you for your interest in the Irene Ransom Bradley School of Nursing at Pittsburg State University. Graduate study is important in preparing nurses for advanced nursing roles. Our school offers a focused Master's in Nursing with emphases in Educational Leadership, Organizational Leadership or Forensic Nursing Leadership.

Graduates with the Educational Leadership emphasis will be prepared to take The Certified Nurse Educator^{CM} (CNE) Examination or AONL Certification examination upon completion of the program. Graduates with the Organizational Leadership emphasis will be eligible to sit for the Certified Nurse Manager and Leader (CNML) examination or the Certified in Executive Nursing Practice (CENP) examination, through the American Organization for Nursing Leadership (AONL). These certification examinations allow candidates to validate their high level of leadership knowledge and skill by becoming certified in CNE, CNML or CENP.

Pittsburg State University is accredited by The Higher Learning Commission: A Commission of The North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. The Higher Learning Commission (HLC) is an independent corporation that was founded in 1895 as one of six regional institutional accreditors in the United States. All current and prospective Master of Science in Nursing applicants will be considered for admission based on both admission requirements and resource availability. Application deadline for first consideration for admission to the nursing program is March 15th for summer, July 15 for fall enrollment and November 15th for spring enrollment. Applications will be accepted until 4:30 PM on these dates, if they fall on a Saturday or Sunday, acceptance will extend to Monday at 4:30 PM. Applications that meet all requirements are reviewed by Graduate Nursing Faculty and ranked based on Undergraduate GPA, Critical Thinking Test Results, References, and Writing Sample.
